A HALLELUJAH WEDDING

AN INTERESTING EVENT AT THE ARMY BARRACKS.

THE GREEK IDEALISTS.

THE INAUGURAL OF DR. DYDE AT QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY.

The Philosophers Who Put the Burden of Great Questions on the Social and Religious Beliefs.—The True Society.—The Staff Has Landed a Long Time.

The following is an outline of the inaugural address of Prof. Dyde, of Queen's University, delivered at the inauguration of the Greek Idealists.

Although the philosophy, certain aspects of which we are to consider, was written some centuries before the birth of Christ, the Greek philosophers, who are now called a dead language, it is much nearer in spirit to our own time and way of life than we would be disposed at the outset to think. Socrates, Plato and Aristotle, the three great lights of Greek idealism, constructed their system of thought not because they were out of touch with the political, social and religious conditions of their day, but because they felt the burden of those questions more intensely than did their contemporaries. Not only the Socrates, e.g., do himself credit as a soldier, but speak a whole life within the walls of his native city in a effort to raise and purify the mind of his country. He and Aristotle, the latter the younger to be a layman in the study of the sciences, were men of their time and their place, and their system of thought was not a mere system of thought, but a system of thought that was to be lived.
