The "Competitive Prayer" Question. Conscientious preachers who desire to do right even in the minutest particulars ed. often bring up for discussion topics that are at once interesting and novel. During a recent conference of Presbyterian ciergymen at Greenock, Scotland, "the question in extemporaneous prayer before being Beensed. On the one hand it was argued that 'prayer would be profanity if paraded as a show exercise,' and that 'competitive prayer was irreverent, while competitive preaching was not.' On the other hand it was maintained that clergymen should be trained in the methods of public prayer, as 'prayer was an important part of their business.' One speaker declared that many slergymen often wept in secret over the mistakes they made while praying in the churches, which they would not have made f they had been taught how to pray when they were students. The debate on the subject was very earnest, but the presbytery did not decide whether theological students should be required to engage in 'competitive prayer.' '




