A WARNING TO GIRLS.

Disowned Ly Parents and Deserted by a Very Worthless Husband.

St. PAUL, Jan. 10. -On Sunday Teresa Camilla Mason, youngest daughter of the late John Mason, a wealthy banker of Toronto, Ont., died of pulmonary consumption. The story of the girl, 24 years of age, is a remarkably sad one. Reared in luxury, the petted child of indulgent parents, a reigning belle in Toronto social circles, her life promised to be fraught with sunshine. A man, distrusted by her parents and relatives, preffered marriage, but the union met with violent opposition. It was the old story-marriage in spite of her family, by whom she was subsequently cast off.

The man for whom she gave up home and happiness deserted her, and with a baby boy she came west to reside with her sister, Mrs. Edward Richardson, who alone sympathized with her in her trouble. About a year and a half ago the husband of Mrs. Richardson was killed in Eau Claire, Wis., and since that time the history of the two women, cut adrift from friends and family, has been a pitiful one. The younger sister was stricken with consumption, but Mrs. Richardson labored faithfully for their support and that of the boy until her sister's condition became such that she was unable to leave her. In a dark and dreary room on East Seventh street the two women passed through the pangs of hunger, and only the approach of starvation induced them to apply for public succour.

The case was taken up by Relief Agent Hutchins and Secretary Markoe, of the St. Vincent de Paul society, and through their efforts the last days of the dying woman were made more comfortable and the Toronto relatives notified. Assistance from Toronto did not arrive, however, until the young woman had passed away. Along with her sister and little child she exacted from them a promise that her remains should be removed to Ontario and buried at the feet of her dead father. Telegrams have since then come from Toronto advising the local authorities to spare no expense in the funeral, and that all bills would be paid.
