

#### A CANAL THROUGH CANADA.

Scheme Projected for a Waterway From Montreal to Lake Huron.

OTTAWA, Jan. 22.—The question of forming an unbroken line of navigation from Montreal to Lake Huron, by the improvement of the Ottawa and French rivers, will engage the attention of parliament during the coming session. The idea is by no means a new one, surveys having been made and estimates as to the cost prepared for carry-ing out the work as far back as 1858, when Walter Shanley, and in 1860, T. C. Clarke, both engineers of considerable note, completed a survey of the proposed work for the information of the government and in the interest of commerce. According to Mr. Clarke's estimate, the distance between Montreal and Chicago would be shortened by 270 miles as compared with the St. Law rence route. In his report Mr. Clarke states that of the total distance between Montreal and lake Huron, 431 miles, 352 miles are already good navigation, requiring no improvement, and that it is perfectly practicable so to improve the remaining 79 miles as to convert the whole chain of waters into a first-class navigation for steam vessels, and to reduce the length of canalling to 21 miles, exclusive of the La chine canal. The scale of navigation attainable, and which he recommended as best suited to the capabilities of the route, was calculated for vessels of 1,000 tons burden with locks 250 feet long, 45 feet wide, with 12 feet of water on the mitre sills. The cost of the work is estimated at \$12,000,000.
