

SCIENCE AND PROGRESS.

THINGS THAT ARE SAID AND DONE

All About the Mannlicher Gun Lately
Adopted by Austria, Which Is Claimed
to Be the Most Perfect One Made Up
to the Present.

Austria, like France, has adopted for the arming of her infantry a gun of small caliber, and has chosen the model shown in the accompanying cut.



NO. I-THE MANNLICUER GUN.

This weapon is of 8 mm, caliber and fires a seel increed ball. The closing of the gun differs from that of guns provided with a bolt. The object of the inventor has been to suppress the lateral motion of the movable breech, and to effect the opening and closing of the gun by a single horizontal motion, such an arrangement permitting of exhausting the magazine of cartridges without removing the weapon from the shoulder.

The opening and closing, explaines L'Illustration, are effected as follows: In order to

topen the weapon, the lever, A, is grasped with the right hand and pulled back. To close the gun, the movable breech is shoved forward by means of the same lever. The gun being loaded, as will be explained further along, the movable head carries along into the chamber the first cartridge of the magazine, and the cock, B, meets the trigger, V, which arrests it. If the pressure on the lever is hept up, the coin, C, enters the bolt, D, and forces it to fall and enter the reces. E. As a repeating

NO. 3-MANNLICHER GUN zine, F, which contains the cartridge lever, G, and the book of the feeder, H. The repetition is completed by a feed box, I, of very light steel plate, containing five cartridges. To fill the magazine, the soldier opens the gun, as shown in Fig. 3, and takes the feed box and introduces it into the magazine through the recess in the socket until the part J has crossed the hook, H. During this operation the last cartridge, which rests upon the upper part of the lever, (), forces this piece to descend (Fig. 2). During the firing, the cartridges rise in succession under the action of the lever, G, and at the moment of the introduction of the last cartridge into the chamber, the lever, experiencing no further resistance, resumes its place (Fig. 8), and the feeding box, which is no longer held, is thrown automatically out of the gun by the pressure of the hook, H.

To consider but the repeating : :echanism, the Mannlicher gun may, as regards its simplicity, the strength of its parts, and its operation, be considered as the most perfect one that has been made up to the present, says the authority quoted.

Hitherto the largest stations have been the Saint Pancras, at London (166,025 square feet), and the Silesia station at Berlin (180,000 square feet). That of Frankfort is double the size of the first named.

THE SAMOA ISLANDS.

The Facts About a Great Bone of Contention Between the I bree Nations.

The Samoa Islands have lately attracted more attention than usual on account of the rival interests of the Americans, English and Germans centered there. The archipelage comprises about 1,160 square miles, and a population estimated at 36,000. The islands are situated under the 13th parallel of south latitude. The first man to explore the islands was a French navigator, and it was proposed to call them the Bougonville archipelago in his honor. The word Samoa is supposed to be derived from Moa, the hereditary name of the king of Manua. In the Samoan language the particle sa prefixed to a proper name signifies the family of. Samoa, then, is supposed to mean the family

A comparison of the traditions and popular songs of the Polynesian tribes leads to the belief that the Samoan group is the parent land of Polynesia, from whence the other islands were peopled.

The Samoans are regarded as an independent people, and although numbering much less than a century ago, are now gaining slightly. About 30,000 of the present population are regarded as Protestants and 6,000 Catholics. A few hundred whites represent the German, English, and American nations. The Polynesian tongue is generally used even in the religious services and chanting of Christian hymns, but the English language has been widely spread through the land by the efforts of the Protestant ministers.

The Samoans are well formed physically, and as a people noted for being more than the average in height, dignified and graceful in movement, and brave. Tattooing is fashionable among them, but the fanciful designs and elaborate work in this respect is not as common as formerly. Through the efforts of the missionaries, and from contact with the whites, they have generally discarded the custom of going in a half-nude state, and follow in a measure the styles of dress used by Europeans.
