



A Sharp Centest in the Township of Oso ... A Prolonged War.

For twelve or fourteen years the township of Oso has, so to speak, been divided against itself-the South against the North-and, until this week the North always held a majority in the county council. A year ago M. P. Avery was elected reeve by a majority of one. The contests in this township have generally been spirited, and this year was by no means an exception, and as a result there has been quite an exciting time in Oso for two months. The clerk of Oso is also clerk of South Sherbrooke, in the county of Leeds. In each of these townships there is but one polling subdivision; and the clerk is therefore ex-officio returning officer in each. Being unable to be present in two places at the same time the clerk appointed a substitute for Oso, William Armstrong, who presided at the nominations on Dec. 31st, and held the election on January 7th, when certain irregularities were said to have occurred. At the nomination, however, Mr. Avery was elected reeve by acclamation, no one having been proposed as reeve against him. Eight candidates stood for councillors, and at the election on January 7th, there was some difficulty between some of the candidates and the pro tem returning officer as to the taking of the votes and counting of the ballots. The candidates for councillors, then declared elected, being threatened with quo warranto proceed ings, decided to disclaim, and Mr. Avery, on the clerk representing that the nomination, as well as the election proceedings, were irregular, disclaimed also, and the clerk proceeded to hold a new election. The nomination was held on the 11th, when Henry Chambers was proposed in opposition to Mr. Avery as reeve. There were also eight candidates nominated for councillors. As evidence that there were no political interests at work it might be mentioned that on each "ticket" were three conservatives and two liberals.

That the contest was a very exciting one may be imagined since 248 votes out a total of 307, including non-residents, dead and absent, were polled-the greatest number ever recorded -and that one voter travelled 350 miles to mark his ballot, while many went fifty, sixty and seventy miles to record their votes. At 9 o'clock in the morning more than fifty voters were at the town hall awaiting the opening of the poll, from which time they crowded to the booth. Both parties were active in bringing their supporters to the polls and rushing them into the booth until 4 o'clock, when all except one of the available voters had been introduced to the returning officer. Although the greatest interest was manifested and a feverish excitement prevailed throughout the day the proceedings were conducted in the most orderly manner. From 3:30 until 5 p.m. the crowd and interested parties were simply waiting on time, there being no voters to seek or canvass. Immediately after 5 o'clock the ballots were counted with this result :

For reeve-M. P. Avery, 135; Henry Chambers, 109; majority for Avery, 26. For councillor - Richard Burke, 124; Alexander McGinnis, 122; Charles Young, 116; Thomas Armstrong, 115; John Donnelly, 114; J. Y. Armstrong, 111; D. Ferguson, 110; George Briggs, 109.

The council of Oso township for 1889 is, therefore, reeve, M. P. Avery; councillors, R. Burke, A. McGinnis, jr., C. Young and Thomas Armstrong. The south triumphed for the first time, having elected Avery, McGinnis and Young. After speeches by the successful candidates the crowd dispersed in an orderly manner. Mr. Cham bers was considered the most formidable opponent who could be brought forward against Mr. Avery, who has won a hard fought battle, and may now be considered the most popular young man in the township of Oso as he certainly is in the county council.


