PROTESTANT NUNS.

Lutheran And Episcopalian, Methodist

And Presbyterian Sisterhoods. A Protestant Sisterhood is a nineteenth century development such as the reformers of three centuries ago could never have thought possible. Even a century ago no such idea would have been tolerated. But to day there are in the ranks of Protestantism over 12,000 black stoled, consecrated nuns. The average U. S citizen has become familiarized with the Episcopalian sisterhoods. He is, however, surprised to learn that the first Protestant nuns were German, not English and instead of being reared in not English, and instead of being reared in an atmosphere of Anglicanism were the crodal descendants of Luther and Zwingle, who looked upon a nun's garb as the livery of the devil. It is equally surprising to learn that the movement has spread beyond the liturgical Episcopalians and Lutherans, and that now the disciples of Calvin and

Wesley are bent upon establishing similar In 1833 a young German pastor, Theodore Eliedner, undertook the work of reviving the mediaval order of deaconesses, of which Phebe, of Cenchrea, was the prototype, and induced a young German girl, Gertrude Reichard, to become the first modern deaconess. A large house was opened at Kaisersworth as the mother house of the order, and, in spite of opposition from Romanist and Protestants alike, the movement expanded until soon there were deaconess houses in Strasburg, Dresden, Breslau, Stettin, and many other European cities. Beyroot, Smyrna, Jerusalem and Constantinople were provided with German deaconesses. All this was due to the zealous labour of Pastor Fieldmer. At the time of his death, in 1864, there were over 1,600 deaconesses engaged in 400 fields of labour. The past 25 years has beheld a still greater increase, and now 7,200 Lutheran deacon-

esses are at work in 1,500 localities. There are forty German deaconesses prosecuting their labour of love in America, nearly all in Philadelphia at the Mary J. Drexel Home. A home is to be opened in Omaha, Neb , and several probationers are undergoing a course of instruction preparatory to conducting that work. The term of probation varies from two to five years, and at the end of that time the novice dons the uniform of the order and is consecrated as

The Episcopal sisterhoods started in England about 1848, were direct imitations of the Lutheran orders, yet differ from them in several important particulars. The Anglican who enters upon a religious life must take it up for all time. Her farewell to the world is irrevocable, and she may never marry. A Lutheran deaconess, on the other hand, may leave the home whenever she deems best. A number of German sisters have given up their life of ministration for marriageable causes, but rarely from any other reason.

Another distinction is in the fac: that the Lutheran sisters are all members of one order, while there are sixteen orders of Episcopal nuns in this country, and many others in England that have no branches here. The Sisterhood of St. Mary and All Saints, at Baltimore, is composed entirely of coloured women, and the order of St. Monica, at Fond du Lac, Wis., is a religious sisterhood of widows. The sisters of the Episcopal church are never known as deaconesses, and their work is largely of an ecclesiastical nature, yet in their functions of nursing, visiting and teaching they nearly resemble the adherents of the Lutheran and Methodist churches.

The Methodist movement had its inception in Chicago in 1887. Eight women were consecrated as deaconesses, and in three months they made 2,751 religious visits. The work gradually developed into training schools for missionaries, and last year a nurses' training school was added A home for Methodist deaconesses has recently been open ed in New York, and plans are on foot for a similar one in Philadelphia.

The Presbyterians, too, have become interested in the movement, and Calvanistic deaconesses will soon be at work helping to rob the world of its pain and sin.
