

DOINGS IN THE DOMINION.

LITTLE HOPE OF CAPTURING OUT LAW MORRISON.

The Mamilton Mystery-Two Dunnville Men Arrested on a Charge of Murder-Immigrants Pouring Into Winnipeg.

MONTREAL, April 5 .- This dispatch dated to-day was received from High Constable Bissonnette by his son: "We leave on a journey of 30 miles in pursuit of Morrison. It is impossible to say when we will capture him and when we will return. We are all in perfect health."

Detective Carpenter, who looks considerably worn from his trip after Morrison, seems to have little hope of the outlaw's capture. "If we could locate him," he said, "there are plenty of good and courageous men there now to arrest him, but he cannot be located." Carpenter started for Megantic to-day to continue his search after

Detective Arcand, who returned from Sherbrooke to-day, says that the populace of the district is quite a little awed by the expedition and dare not move openly in favor of the outlaw. The general opinion however seems to be that dorrison will not be arrested. His knowledge of the locality is far superior to that of his would-be captors, and everybody is willing if not diif he should be in danger of arrest.

HAMILTON'S MYSTERY.

No Trace of Miss Mackelean-Died from His Injuries-The Jersey Sale.

HAMILTON, April 5. Jeremiah Durphy, who fell from the roof of Hendris's stables on Monday, breaking his leg and injuring his head, died at 4.30 this morning. He leaves a widow and one child.

Although five days have clapsed since the disappearance of Miss Louisa Mackelcan no trace of the missing lady has been discovered. Some circumstances point to foul play and that theory is gaining ground. A large searching party comprising many prominent citizens has been organized and will make a systematic and thorough attempt to-morrow to probe the mystery.

CHARGED WITH MURDER.

Two Dunnville Men Arrested for Last November's Mysterious Murder.

DUNNVILLE, April 5. Government Detective Murray of Toronto yesterday afternoon arrested Joe Clemmo of Dunnville. He secured his prisoner about 10 miles from Essex Centre, where he was working in a saw mill, and landed him in Cayuga jail last night. Mr. Murray came here this morning and this afternoon arrested Sam Smith and has taken him to Cayuga. The prisoners are charged with the murder of an unknown man here last November. It is charged that they first robbed the body and then threw it in the canal, where it was found on Nov. 9.

The arrest has caused great excitement here. Detective Murray deserves great credit if he has secured the right parties; all hope of finding the murderer had long since been abandoned.

He paid his fine and then lodged a complaint with the Chief of Police against the officer who arrested him.
