



You would have seen faultlessly dressed young swells, who had all their lives been enamored of fancy boiled white shirts, wearing delicately colored and corded flanne, shirts, with sailors' knot ties; substantial looking, middle aged men, brokers and lawyers probably, wearing spotlessly white flannel shirts, subdued by gray or black ties; even old men of most tremendous dignity, clad in somber black, but wearing flannel shirts and fourin-hand cravats just the same. Mingled with an appearance of cool comfort these men had a look of subdued but eternal defiance, as though daring anybody to question their right to wear any sort of shirt they chose,

sirrah. At the dinner table, at the seaside, in the country, flannel shirts everywhere. And the fiat has gone forth that the flannel shirt is to rule the coming summer, and linen shirt makers and laundrymen are gnashing their teeth and asking the steely stars, "Can such things bef" It was only a short time ago that one of the largest fancy shirt manufactories in the United States failed on account of the flannel shirt craze.



James N. Huston, Treasurer-Ellis H. Roberts Appointed Assistant Treasurer.

James N. Huston, who has been selected by President Harrison to be treasurer of the United States, is a citizen of Indiana. He was born near Greencastle, Pa., about 36 years ago. His father took his family to Indiana and settled in Connersville. The father

engaged in the banking business and made a large fortune, which the son inherited. Mr. Huston has for some years been at the head of the banking house established by his father. He also owns and operates several farms, be-2 sides being engaged in manufacturing



1883 Mr. Huston was elected a member of the Indiana legislature, and in 1885 he was sent to the senate. Two years ago he was chosen chairman of the Republican state central committee. In 1888 he served as a delegate at large to the Chicago Republican convention, and at one time was spoken of as a candidate for governor, but declined to permit his name to be used on account of his connection with the state committee. He is said to be the best political organizer in the state. He is a good speaker, though he has not been trained as

Ellis H. Roberts, appointed assistant treasurer in New York by President Harrison, was born in Utica, N. Y., in 1827. He began life as a printer, but entered Yale college and

was graduated in



Republican conventions. In 1867

he was a member of the New York legislature. In 1870 he was sent to congress as a Republican, and served on the committee of ways and means. Mr. Roberts was made a doctor of laws from Hamilton college in 1869 and from Yale in 1884. He has been president of the Fort Schuyler club and of the Oneida society. He has delivered a num-ber of public addresses, and is the author of "The Planting and Growth of the Empire

The Late Rev. G. Bryan, of Encland. A lengthy clipping is to hand from the Lincoln, Rutland and Stamford, Eng., Mercury, giving a sketch of the life and labora of the late Rev. G. Bryan, a relative of Miss Bryan, of this city. His memory will remain fragrant for many years, in the hearts, not only of his flock, but throughout the neighborhood. He was 89 years of age. In 1824, he became perpetual curate of Mumby St. Leonards, where he commenced afresh the services of the church, which had remained dormant for 140 years. In 1833 he was appointed to the vicarage and removed to Alford where he died Feb. 16th, 1889. He was in lawers abundant, schools and churches now standing as monuments of his energy and zeal. The deceased clergyman was also a poet, and numerous hymns from his pen are in use. He was an earnest advocate and generous supporter of the British and foreign bible society, the church missionary society, the London society for promoting christianity among the Jews, and other evangelical and charitable societies. He was steadfastly opposed to the innovations of "ritualistic caprice" in public worship, and to the multiplication of vain ceremonies in religion, and frequently expressed his abhorrence of them. The person of the Rev. George Bryan is lost to eight, but his work remains; he has left good and lasting marks of his life where he
