



Elijah M. Haines.

Elijah M. Haines, the "sage of Waukegan" as he was jocularly called, whose death was lately announced, served in the ranks of more than one party and did several things well. Before he war he was an independent, during the war an ardent supporter of the Lincoln administration, soon after an "Andy Johnson man" and a candidate for congress on that ticket, and subsequently a Democrat with extremely independent tendencies which sometimes showed themselves in rather amusing ways. All this time he was doing a great deal of good writing, published several works on the laws relating to townships, local organizations and law practice before justices, as well as a history of Lake county, Illinois, He leaves a recent exhaustive work on the American Indians and the manuscript of another giving his recollections for fifty years,

Mr. Haines was born in western New York, but removed to Illinois in 1835, when he was about 12 years old. For forty years, ever since he became a voter, he has been active in Illinois politics, and has held many offices, the highest being that of state superintendent of schools. He was a representative from Lake county in the legislature of 1861, and in the constitutional convention of 1869, and again in the legislature continuously from 1871 till his death. It may be said that he, was twice speaker of the Illinois house of representatives, but whether he was rightfully so the second time was long a matter of controversy, and this it was that gave Mr. Haines a national fame.

The two parties were a tie in the legislature and Mr. Haines an "unknown quantity;" he organized a party for himself, and when expostulated with, replied: "Gentlemen, I have always admired the English system by which the speaker must go with the majority; now if the Democrats will elect me, I will be with them and make a majority," and they had to do it. The result was a contest prolonged tril one Democratic member died, the Republishns secured his successor, and so Gen. Logan was chosen United States senator. Many anecdotes are told of the amusing. ways in which he often threw the house into confusion, but no matter how absurd his conduct seemed at the time, it always turned out that he had one object in view, and he nearly always accomplished it, the opposition being thrown off their guard by what they regarded as his buffoonry. He was peculiarly vigilant in guarding the interests of his constituents. One of his peculiarities was that he would never tell his age; but as he often told of himself and brother walking from Detroit to Chicago when he was but 12 years old, it is assumed that he was born in 1822 or

Material Now Wasted.

Mr. Bawden makes this calculation on the fuel question : Every thousand feet of sawed lumber will furnish one half cord of wood. There is shipped down some of the rivers a large quantity of saw logs, probably on an average, yearly, of 45,000,000 feet, which would give 52,500 cords of wood, and from which they could obtain thirty-five bushels of charcoal per cord. Allowing one hundred bushels of charcoal per ton the year's shipment of timber would smelt about 7,000 tons of iron.

The most remote point reached by George Kennan in his Siberian trip was the mines of Kara, 5,000 miles from St. Petersburg and about 1,000 miles from the Pacific coast. The narrative of his adventures at these mines will begin in the June Century and be continued through several numbers. The mines are the private property of the Tsar, are worked for his benefit, and it is to them that the Nihilists are sent when the Tsar is pleased to commute a death sentence to penal servitude in the mines. Hence an unusual number of political prisoners are gathered at Kara.
