TOPICS FROM TORONTO

COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES WYCKLIFFE COLLEGE.

The True Blues Session Finisher - t New College for Boys-The Reschauch Inquest Opened.

Toronto, May 17 .- The corporation of Trinity University met yesterday and adopted the report of the special committee appointed to prepare a scheme for raising a fund for the enlargement and improvement of the college buildings and for other purposes together, with a circular embodying an appeal for a sum of \$70,000 for those objects. Subscriptions to the amount of \$6000 have already been promised.

Coroner Duncan opened an inquest into the cause of the death of Mrs. Rosebauch, 15 Mission-avenue, at the Willard Hotel, corner of Teraulay and Gerrard, yesterday merning. A jury was empannelled and after viewing the body an adjournment was made till Monday to allow the .detectives who have charge of the case to bring iorward testimony. The coroner explained the nature of the case to the jurymen. It is understood that the death of Mrs. Rosebauch was ceasioned by an attempt to procure abortion. Her husband, who attended the inquest, was much agitated over the trugic attair which has left in his hands the sole care of three small children.

The annual session of the Ontario Grand Lodge of True Blues was finished yesterday. Brother Newman, Grand Master, presided. These officers were elected: Broth r Mersart, Associate Deputy Grand Master for Lindsay; Sister Mrs. William Teasdale, Associate Grand Chaplain for Merritton; Geo. Worrell, Associate Grand Secretary; Mrs William Robson, Associate Grand Treasurer, Hamilton. The following received the degree D.D.G.M: William Teasdale, Wentworth; James Mustice, London; G. E. Hill, Toronto; Wm. McKee, Frontenac; J. Sloan, Peterboro West; J. Jackson, Hastings: A J. Gibson, Ontario; Miles S. Plumley, Lennox and Addington; J. J. Shaw, Victoria; Thos. Cann, Northumberland; Alf. H. Monkman, Manitoba and the Northwest; H. Reinhart, Wentworth; J. McMillan, East Durham; J. F. McGill, West Durham; A. Manning, East Peterboro. A letter was read 'rom the Cit zens' Committee and the different delegates furnished with literature and petitions to commence a campaign for disallowance of the Jesuit Bill, or for the dissolution of the Dominion House. The lodge then rose to the Blue Apron degree and discussed the advisability of extending the degree to ladies. It was unanimously agreed to do so and a committee was appointed to make a second degree form. The lodge will meet at St. Catharines on the second Tuesday of May,

The vote to-morrow on the bylaw for \$600,000, in addition to the million dollars already on hand for the erection of the proposed new municipal and county buildings, will be one of the largest ever taken on a money bylaw here. Opinion is about equally divided - one party contending that a million dollars would build a fine enough Court House and that the present plans should be modified, and the other party contending that the present plans are the most desirable and should be carried out.

A new college for boys is about to be established in St. Catharines. The first general meeting of shareholders was held yesterday. Mr. T. R. Merritt, Vice-President of the Imperial Bank, was chairman over a large and influential gathering. Ridley College, as it will be called, will have a close connection with the Provincial University. About \$50,000 have been subscribed. The corporation is expending about \$25,000 on land and buildings at St. Catharines, where the college will be situated. These directors were elected: President, T. R. Merritt; Vice-President, A. H. Campbell; Secretary-Treasurer, Fred. J. Stewart. Directors-Judge Senkler, Judge Benson, Judge Muir, Judge Macdonald, Charles Moss, Q.C., S. H. Blake, Q.C., N. W. Hoyles, R. S. Gurd, V. Croyn, J. Herbert Mason, Robert Jenkins, Geo. S. Gillespie, Robert Gilmor, B. Homer Dixon, Sir W. P. Howland, Stapleton Caldecott, Charles E. Hooper. The head master, it is understood, is to be Mr. J. O. Miller, a graduate of Toronto University.

When they arrived at the place of meeting all arrangements had been made for the mill, but ('ampbell, one of the combatants, had not put in an appearance. The officers herefore departed, but on their way back met the missing pugilist in a cab. He was fully prepared to take his share in the affray, but when the detectives requested him to change his mind he did so. The remarkable part of the affair was that Grand Trunk Constable Harrison was going with the figh er, apparently with the idea of seeing fair play. The proposed set-to is said to be the outcome of an old feud.

AN AWFUL POSSIBILITY. Was Mind Reader Bishop Bead Before

He Was Carved ? NEW YORK, May 16. - The wife and mother of Washington Irving Bishop, the mindreader, have arrived in this city, and both claim that Bishop was not dead, but merely in a trance, when the physicians made their post-mortem examination, and that his death was caused by the surgical instruments. It seems that but four hours elapsed from the time of his reported death until Drs. Irwin, Ferguson and House were making a post-mortem examination of the body. The widow of the mind-reader states that he has suffered several times from cataleptic attacks, and has lain in a trance, apparently dead, for periods varying from six to

fifty-two hours. On one occasion in Malta, she says, physicians pronounced him dead, and advised preparations for his interment. His friends held a different belief, and in a little over two days he recovered. About two years ago Bishop, while suffering with a dangerous illness, was treated by Dr. Thomas S. Robertson of No. 28 East Twentieth-street, this city. While at tire doctor's house he had a cataispaid attack, and remained in a trange-like condition for two days. The physicians who performed the autopsy, however, say there can be no doubt of Bishop's death before the autopsy was deeided upon.


