THE LATE GEN. HARNEY.

He Was the Oldest Officer in the Army of the United States. Gen. Harney, just previous to his death, which occurred recently in Florida...

In 1818 he was appointed a lieutenant in the First United States Infantry from civil life. He was then a magnificent specimen of a man, standing six feet three inches in his stockings...

In 1825 Harney was made a captain. In 1828 he was in command of Fort Winnebago, and Jefferson Davis went there a lieutenant, having been graduated in that year from West Point. They spent two years together and became intimate friends.

In 1846 he became colonel and took part in the Mexican war. He was first given the command of the Texas frontier. Advancing into Mexico, on his way to Vera Cruz he routed the enemy and captured a strong position...

In April, 1861, while he was on his way from St. Louis to Washington, he was arrested by the Confederates at Harper's Ferry and taken to Richmond. His old associates there urged him to join the southern cause...

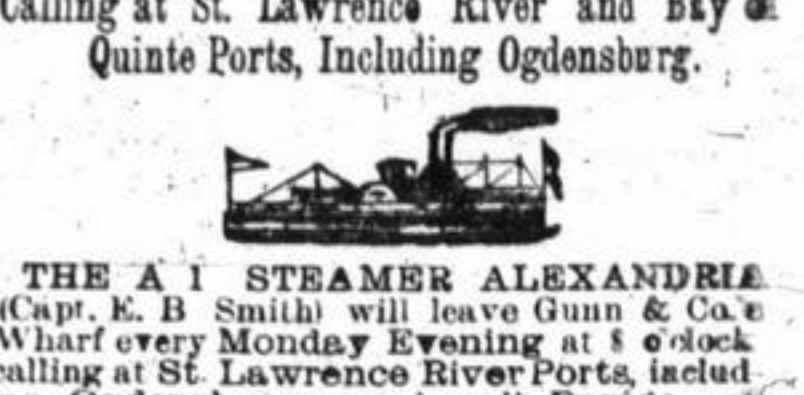
