

The Societe Centrale d'Architecture, of Paris, has received a very curious communication. A system of building houses entirely of sheet iron has been invented. ### Preparing Ooffee for Market.

There is as much difference in the means employed in preparing the coffee for market as there is in those in use in different parts of the United States in preparing wheat after it is harvested. Some plantations, notably the large ones, have costly and rapidly working machinery, which frees the berries from pulp, dries them, breaks and winnows away the outer covering or shell, breaks and separates the membranous covering from each seed and sorts out the grains by sizes; and they have also steam drying machines, so that both time and manual labor are saved, and often a better quality of coffee is secured. On small plantations, and especially remote ones, the most primitive methods still prevail; the berries are freed from pulp by a slowly acting machine of two wheels revolving in opposite directions, but close together, between which water carries them and from which they escape into a separating trough. They still have to be dried in the sun, winnowed through a fanning mill or by hand with a hand fan, and put through rude processes of breaking and freeing from the endocarp and are then sorted by hand. - Almont Barnes,

Those Little Green Crystals. The new chemical antipyrin is now almost as commonly used as quinine, and, like the latter, it is prescribed in combination with all kinds of medicines. A favorite combination is with the sweet spirit of niter. If the sweet spirit of niter is not perfectly pure, it will cause the formation of a green precipitate called the iso-nitroso-antipyrin. Now when a person sees a green colored medicine he naturally thinks of Paris green, and imagines it must be poison. Druggists have even been sued for damages when they dispensed such a combination and the patient failed to get well. But recent experiments on rabbits and dogs have shown that the green crystals are perfectly harmless, and only those druggists and chemists who are not up with the times look with fear on the pretty little green crystals.-St. Louis Globe-Democrat.
