

London, Jan. 21.—The Standard's correspondent at St. Petersburg says the powers threaten to leave Greece, Servia and Bulgaria to their own devices if they do not disarm. It is suggested to compensate Greece by making King George the governor of Albania. Two hundred Servian prisoners in Bulgaria, not wishing to return to Servia, will join the Bulgarians. The Porte has contracted with Krupp for many guns, those made at the Turkish factory being useless. The outlay will press beavily upon the Turkish treasury.
