POLICE OFFICERS SHOT

A FATAL COLLISION WITH THE STRIKING TAKES PLACE AT CHICAGO.
Firearms Called Into Play, and More Blood Spilled—The Aired Police Who Took the Strike is Yesterday—Can Peace Be Had?

Chicago, April 22.—Seventy-five men in connection with the Lake Shore strike to-day. If plans are carried out a force of 160 deputy sheriffs and 50 Pinkerton men will be put in the company yards, and under their protection an attempt will be made to see the freight train in motion.

Chicago, April 22.—It is expected that the strikers will not allow the police men or firemen to enter the Lake Shore yards. Another detail of one hundred deputies have gone to 43rd street, where it is expected the strikers are tearing up the tracks, etc.

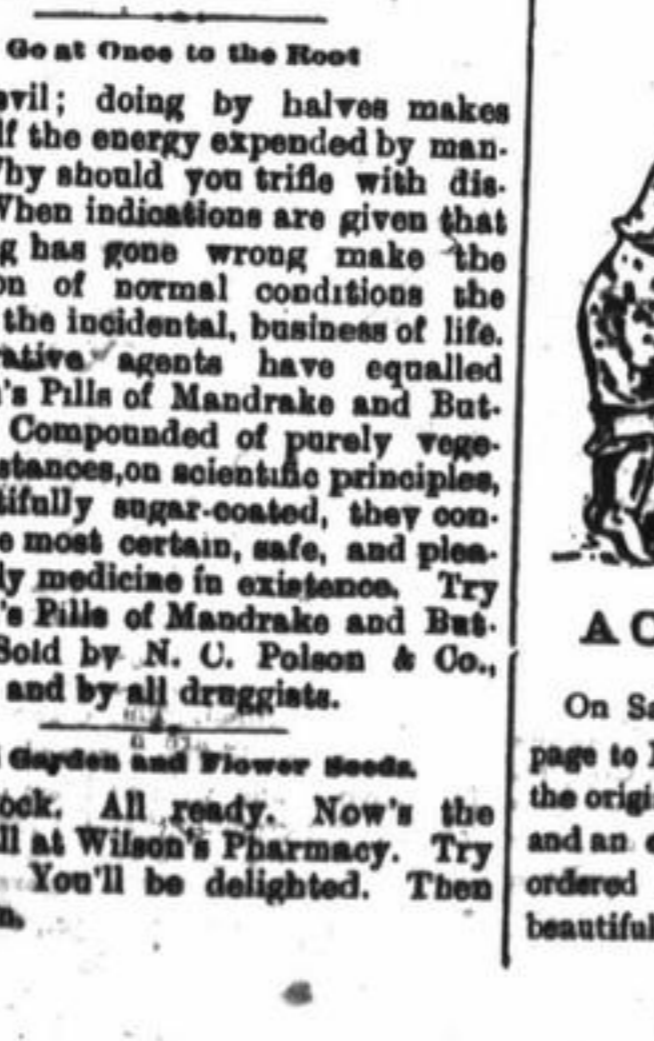
