FOTH LAKE AND RAIL. No man could heretofore understand just why they reduced rail freights on grain to a rate they cannot carry it for by rail. Whatever the cause of this the effect is to ruin the prospects of lake vessels generally for a paying season and to deprecate the value of sail vessel property, and also the value steam vessel property that is not owned by the railroads. A railroad official said: "The plan is plain enough. Can't vessel men make it out yet? 
