PRIVATE BANK FAILURE.

Reckless Extravagance of a Young Banker-A Course of Fraud-A Father's Lasses.

London, April 6,-Bailey Harrison, son of John Harrison, a wealthy mill owner of Parkhill, formed the acquaintance of Miss Tillson, daughter of E. D. Tillson, a wealthy citizen of Tilsonburg. and subsequently married her. After the marriage Bailey concluded to start a private bank in Tilsonburg, taking for a partner Dr. McTaggart, a banker of Parkhill. A large concern was opened. In one month the transactions are said to have amounted to \$130,000. It is now about four years since the office was started in Tilsonburg, and according to the books it is very shortly after that young Bailey commenced a course of systemactic fraud. 
