



\$15,000 IN COMPETITION. FENCE INVENTIONS.

Two Articles Which Now Command Good Deal of Public Attention -Merits Discussed.

Prof. Davy, who has taught thirty bands in this province, and who is now a citizen of Kingston, has completed his designs of a new style of iron fence. The idea is one upon which he has worked for 14 years. The professor wants a partner with a capital of about \$3,000 or \$4,000, and purposes going into the manufacture of the fence which he holds the patents. Mr. Davy's designs are good. 


