## BISHOP'S AUTHORITY SUSTAINED.

Sir:—Dr. Brettart.

Dear Sir.—During the recent absence of the Bishop of Kingston from his Diocese the following paragraph, copied from the Belleville Courier, appeared in your journal, and only last evening was brought under His Lordship's notice:

"A letter from Miss Brettart referring to her brother, the Rev. Henry Brettart, says the suspension imposed by Bishop Cleary was reversed by the authorities at Rome, remitting him as present. His Lordship would have believed that Miss Brettart had not written or authorized the foregoing statement; but, as the author who wrote it is, the Bishop desires it given to the subscribers of the Episcopal office and the maintenance of just respect for clerical discipline, to inform your readers of the absolute fidelity of the assertion."

The Rev. H. Brettart has been absolved from suspension by the Bishop of Kingston's sole authority, communicated to him by for that purpose twelve months ago, on condition of certain engagements being given in writing by Father Brettart. These engagements having been, after prolonged hesitation, written and subscribed by the Rev. gentleman, the Bishop of Liverpool, exercising those vicarious powers, removed him partially of his restraint; and the terms of engagement satisfied the act of the Bishop of Liverpool and forthwith restored Father Brettart to full priestly liberty by the issue of Testimonial Letters, conceived in kind and generous spirit, enabling him to receive employment in any Diocese of his choice, exclusive of the Diocese of Kingston.
