A BLACK LIST.

Ottawa, Sept. 17.—Several prominent wholesale houses in New York, Boston and Chicago have been placed on the list of firms furnishing their Canadian customers with blank invoices for the purpose of assisting them to defraud the Dominion of revenue by filling up invoices at nominal values on which Customs duties are assessed and duty paid. A black list containing the names of such firms has been placed on file in each Customs House, and it is understood that it will be given to the public soon.
