He was 24 years of age and really acted as Sheriff, his father being a very old gentleman.

THE BAITING TRADE.

The farmers are moving than baiter, but slowly, the prices offered being still extremely low. Messrs. Irwin & Sloan of Ottawa, in their weekly circular, state that the receipts of baiter to date bear a poor comparison with those at corresponding dates in former years, but they have been sufficient to meet the wants of the trade. The market has been steady in price with nearly all the offerings taken on the basis of \$1 for No. 1 Canada and 70c for 2 Canada.
