A FATAL FESTIVAL. Tragedy at a Muights of Pythias' Gather.

Lu-Dend and Wounded.

A Cincinnati despatch says: Rumors have reached here of a calamity at Shanesville (Tuscarawas county) caused by the floor giving way at the Knights of Pythias' festival. Two persons are reported killed; about 100 were injured. The building took fire, and several persons were badly burned. Later-Tho Knights are of the first families of the place, and the gathering included the intelligence and beauty of the neighborhood. The band had just ceased play. ing, when a crash was heard, and the floor began settling lengthwise in the centre. The timber had slipped off the post in the rear, and pulled out the brick wall in front. The centre settled rapidly, and broke lengthwise. The falling floors barricaded the front doors. but were soon chopped down. The chandelier in the storeroom below broke and oil spilled over a number of persons.
