Its importance was only recently recognized by the C. P. R. Syndicate, which has decided to build a branch of its Line from Winnipeg to Selkirk, on the west of the river, in order to connect with navigation. For this the town has granted a bonus of \$70,000, and the road will be in operation by the 1st of August of this year, and arrangements are now being made to vote a bonus for a bridge across the Red River at this point, to make a direct line for through traffic to the west and east. It is the County Town of the County of Lisgar, in the heart of the finest prairie country, well supplied with fine timber, and immediately to the east are the great forests from which a great portion of Manitoba must for years

obtain its supplies. Selkirk is beautifully situated on a high eminence on the west bank of the Red River, 25 miles north of the City of Winnipeg, and 20 miles south of Lake Winnipeg. It has at present a population of 700 inhabitants, and its growth is very rapid. It is the chief point of navigation in Manitoba, being the head of deep water navigation on Lake Winnipeg, and its importance in this respect must continue on account of the rapids in the Red River between Selkirk and Winnipeg. The Hudson Bay Company are building extensive docks at Selkirk, it being their distributing point for the whole of the North West. It is also the terminus of the proposed Hudson Bay Railway, and the Hudson Bay Transportation Company, for which the stock has all been subscribed, and which is building a number of the finest boats yet floated in the North-West.
