CONDENSED TELEGRAMS

The stock market was steady this morning. The graduates of McGill University held their annual dinner last night. Danenhauer was received by the Emperor and Empress of Russia yesterday. Yesterday 102 women and children, whose relatives had already emigrated, were forwarded to Hamburg by 98 Jews from Jassy. All are going to Canada.
