Follest says he was only a few feet from the spot where the mishap occurred that he saw the horse stumble and dis lodge the driver, that in trying to recover the animal stumbled a second time and went down, jamming Dempster's head between his hips and the shafts riage passed over his body. Follest rushed forward and was the first to pull Dempster from under the carriage, and with his own handkerchief, taken from the breast of his tunic, wipe away the blood which gushed from his mouth one of the first to examine and administer to the wounded man, and help to put him upon the stretcher which conveyed him to the city.
