Where Gur Burplus is Going - A Free frip to Canada -- Our Own Mon

In Manchester the walls are placard ed with advertisements of the Cauadian emigration agents to the effect that in Canada mechanica can sara Ave dollare per day, and common laboring men two dollars and a half, and the announce-ment is also made that they can have their passage paid, so that there can be no risk of loss. According to the state ment of these men whole families, men, women and children, are brought to this country at the expense of Canada and landed here, many of them without a cent. They each pay three pounds and the Government pays the balance of their passage, including board to their destination, amounting to those dropped That in their answers to strangers reply, emigrants, unable to procure work at "I'm a young man; wife's older than I." any price, went over to the United States, after our Government had paid

their expenses to Brockville, Nobedy has any objection to emi grants from Europe if they are of the right class, but there is no demind, no room in Cauada for men who have not money enough to pay their own passage. We want emigrants with some means to take up land in the North West, but we do not at present want men who are willing to work for their board. If this thing continues wages are bound to come down, and they are not now any too high to enable a man with a family to live ou, with all the neces-
