



A bag costs \$1.50, which, before the N.P., was sold at \$1.10. At dinter he may eat beef or mutton at 15c; smoked bacon at 18c., green bacon at 15c., or barrelled pork at 14c. His common codfish is worth 8c., which previously cost 5c. or 6c. Labrader herrings are worth 30c. per dozen, or if rate of 35c. for four dozen. Sausages are sold for 15c. per lb. If he likes biscuit he has to pay from 8c. to 14c. a lb. for them, an increase of 2c. in any case. Butter costs him 25c. to 27c., while eggs

are worth 25c. per dozen. Potatoes are 80c. per bag; apples \$1.00 to \$1.15 per bag; cheese 15c., and lard 17c. per lb. In the vegetable kingdom prices are moderate. Tomatoes retail at from 40c. to 50c. per bushel; cabbages, 5c. to 7c. per head; omions, 75c. to \$1 per bush.; cauliflowers, 5c. to 10c. per head; turnips, 40c. to 50c. per bushel; bests, 50c.

per bushel. Fowls are beyond the means of the poor man, yet, for rare occasions some sort of game is desired. The prices to be paid, then, are, for turkeys, \$1 to \$2; geese, 50c. to 75c.; chickens per pair, 40c. to 60c.; partridge, 60c. per pair; ducks, 60c. to 75c. per pair. All classes of delicacies are away up.
