GENERAL HOSPITAL. Monthly Meeting and Annual Election of Officers—A Small Profit in the Year's Accounts.

Yesterday the monthly meeting of the Board of Governors of the General Hospital was held. The annual election took place. Dr. Strange being thanked for his service in the chair, and again elected to it. Mr. J. E. Clarke, the Secretary, holds permanent office.

The annual statements of receipts and expenditure show a deficit of about \$290 on the year's transactions, due to the very little given by the public in support of the institution. It is very fortunate that it is well endowed, as well as well sustained by governments.

The receipts chiefly were: From Ontario Government, \$3464.65; Dominion Government, \$900.00; Kingston Corporation, \$157.50; Lennox and Addington, grant for three years, \$300; pay patients, \$682; income from property, \$854.75; donations, \$134.48; from investments, \$526.20; hospital practice, \$108.00; interest on daily balance, \$102.57; product of live stock and garden, \$562.62.

The expenditures were chiefly: Food, \$3,280.03; furnishings, \$896.06; repairs, \$228.21; drugs, \$284.83; fuel, \$401.38; salaries, \$1,274.71.

Last month an equal number of patients were received and discharged; three men died; one boy and one girl were born; 37 patients remain.

A complaint of want of order among visiting students was referred to the visiting physicians. The Board declared that the old fence in front of the building on Stuart street, "must go." It will not be replaced.
