
THE EVENT WHICH OCCURS ON WE NESDAY-A TECRNICAL EXPLANA TION OF IT.

On Wednesday next will occur phenemenen which none now living w nee again. A circular black spot, having lated a diameter one thirty-first that of the sun, will traverse the seuthern portion of the disk of the latter, meving obliquely apwards from east to west. The time occupied by the transit at Kingston wil be, roughly speaking, from about 9 a.n

These transits take place in pairs more frequently than those of Venus with 8 years between the two transits The following list gives the dates of the

ight transits nearest our own time 1631 - Dec. 6. 1874 - Dec. 8. 1639 - Dec. 4 1882 -Dec. 6. 1761 - June 5. 2004-June 7. 1769 - June 3. 2012-June 5.

The first transit ever seen was that of 624. Venus is a little smaller than ne earth and is considerably nearer to it than she is to the sun.
