MAYOR'S INTENTIONS.

Mr. Britton did not altogether agree with Mr. Agnew on this point, but he was still of the opinion that the proper way to deal with this matter was to submit a bonus by law to the people.

DRAWING ALDERMEN OUT.

Both Mr. P. R. Henderson and Mr. J. Minnes afterwards contended strongly for the bonus as the only thing which would guarantee success.

THE CITY SOLICITOR.

The City Solicitor, who had been patiently listening to the discussion, advanced what seemed to be a most favorable legitimate plan of helping the cotton company—that a by-law for \$15,000 be submitted to the people with the main and distinct proviso, that the cotton company do bind itself, on consideration of the bonus, to pay taxation upon one half of its actual assessed value.
