MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT. PREPARING FOR THE ENSUING ELECTIONS—TWO HOLIDAYS FITLY DECLARED.

High School Trustees—A Statement Submitted—Assessment of Year? Property, expenditure and other financial details.

The regular meeting of the City Council took place last evening. There were present: Mayor Penas, Aids, Allen, Anglin, John Capron, R. J. Carson, Clements, Gage, Gaskin, C. F. Gildersleeve, J. P. Gildersleeve, Gordon, Irving, Law, McCannock, McCreary, McMahon, Robinson, Snytle, J. Wilson and Wm. Wilson.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. From G. A. Kirkpatrick, Secretary of the Collegiate Institute Board, informing the Council that under Section 14, Chapter 41, V.C., passed by the Legislature of Ontario, at the last session, the appointment of two High School Trustees is to be made at the next meeting of the Municipal Council to be held in the month of December of each year.

From Mrs. W. Skinner, asking on behalf of the ladies of the street cleaning club, a rebate of the rent of the City Hall as the proceeds were for church purposes only.

On motion of Ald. McCannock the petition was granted on the condition that the rent be paid in advance.

A letter was read from Mr. E. Garvin, to the effect that some months ago he laid a petition before the Council asking for compensation for land appropriated for the opening up and extension of Montreal Street.

The petition of R. M. Bess, T. Haxby and W. Martin, in regard to the remission of taxes, were referred to the Court of Revision.

From G. F. Taylor, W. Pandy, J. M. Allen, G. S. Oldrieve, J. J. Haxby et al., asking for a remission of the assessment of their vacant property. The rates of freight having been low and the railway wages high during the past season their business had been comparatively unprosperous.
