THE CAITLE TRADE DISTURBED RUMORS OF RESTRICTIONS ON IMPORTATIONS INTO ENGLAND.

(New York Tribune.) Much excitement has been cansed within a day or two among officers of steamship companies and dealers interest ed in the exportation of cattle to England, by the reported action of the British Government in prohibiting further port arose from the action of the inspectors at Liverpool imprdering slaughtered 265 beeves which arrived at that port on Sunday last. They were shipped from Portland on the Ontario, January 14. and were in sound condition at sailing; but the inspectors claim to have found them sick with pleuro-pneumonia It is learned that although the order forbidding the importation had not been issued, yet the Privy Council had the matter under advisement. All matters relating to quarantine and health at British ports are controlled by the Privy Council the President of which is the Duke of Richmond. Last year an Act of Parliament was passed ordering all cattle to be slaughtered at the ports where they were received. By a special order of the Council, cattle from the United States were exempted from this provision, as there was then no disease among

An almirable epitoms of the views which should guide legislation for the prevention of Yellow Fever has been presented to the committees of the Senate and House of Representatives by the Board of Experts, who went South to investigate the ravages of last year. The disease is described as specific, not malerial, exotic and attacking all men but especially white men. It was not known to the people of the Eastern Hemisphere until after the discovery of America by Columbus. It is traced to the West India Islands, and thence at various times it has been carried to Europe, Africa, North and South America. It has invaded the present territorial limits of the United States 88 different times since 1693. For 77 out of these 88 years we have evidence more or less complete of importation, and in 71 out of these 77 the evidence points to the West Indies as the source of infection. Cholera meets with admirable attention in this report, and it is dealt with as purely a foreign disease. The practical preventive measures suggested include the method of freezing out by ship, provided at quarantine, and the plans for vessels to apply SHOP, thought by some to have been caused by the extreme cold to which the animals this process, now being devised at the Navy Yard, will probably be adopted, and receive an appropriation to carry forward the experiments.
