THE ONTARIO LEGISLATURE.

After routine on Friday the Premier stated, in reply to a question from Mr. Baxter, that the Government had no intention to introduce this session, a measure looking to the assumption by the Province of the entire management and of Mr. Meredith, a return was ordered showing the number and cost of appeals to the General Sessions against deci sion of M gistrates under the Master and Servant's Act during the last two years. With the consent of the Government Mr. Me edith's Bill to disqualify license inspectors and commissioners from holding municipal offices, and Mr. Scott's Bill making it necessary that all Capital expenditures out of the Endowment Fund of Upper Canada College and the University of Toronto should be first sanctioned by the Legislature, were read second time, and referred to special

On the motion to grant the sum of \$111,250 to defray the expenses of legislation, after a few unimportant objections to certain items, a long discussion took place on the sessional indemnity, which was by the estimates fixed at \$600 instead of \$800. The discussion was started by the leader of the Opposition, and al though much time was occupied with the matter early in the session the greater part of a long sitting was wasted in going over and over the same ground. The debate grew at times extremely personal, much more so than any previous discussion of the session. One of the few redeeming features of it was the earnest appeal of the Commissioner of Public Werks on behalf of the Civil Service and the admission of the leader of the Opposition that its members were entitled to the utmost consideration in the matter of remuneration—an admission which he qualified somewhat by claiming the right to move for a reduction of such salaries as the Opposition thought too large. One of the worst features of it was the accusation brought by the leader of the Opposition against Mr. Fetris of retailing a private conversation on the floor of the House, while almost in the same breath he made use of an equally private conversation between himself and the Commissioner of Crewn Lands. A motion by Dr. Clarke to cut out the item of \$400 for the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery was lost, and the same gentleman gave notice that he would move on Concurrence to abolish the salary already voted in Committee for the Inspector of
