DAIRYMEN'S ASSOCIATION.

THE SECOND ANNUAL MEETING AT INGER-SOLL.

Ingersoll, February 19.—The second annual meeting of the Dairymen's Association of Western Ontario opened to-day, President Benjamin Hopkins presiding. After the appointment of committees, Prof. J. J. Bell, of Belleville, delivered a very interesting address on butter-making and the butter trade.

Hon. X. A. Willard, of Little Falls, N. Y., followed with a description of butter-making in Iowa creameries where butter, taking the sweepstakes prize at the Centennial and National fairs in New York, was produced.

An interesting discussion followed on the number and success of creameries in this country, &c. The gentlemen who took part in this discussion were J. McKergill, of Belleville, E. Barnard, of E. Carleton Place, and W. Moulton, E. Carleton Place. Mr. Barnard, Director of Agriculture of Quebec, gave a very interesting address, and referred to the phosphate deposit at this country.

Rev. Mr. Clarke and others made highly commendable remarks.

Professor Arnold delivered an excellent address on butter-making and handling, in which he explained how every penny of ordinary intelligence could produce an article that would remain pure and fresh not only for months, but years, and could be shipped to any part of the world, with the certainty of arriving in good condition.

The Secretary was authorized to communicate with the various steamship companies relating to their facilities for carrying dairy produce, meats, &c., in their steamers, with refrigerator accommodations.
