PUBLIC ACCOUNTS. THE DOMINION'S INCOME AND OUTLAY.

According to the Public Accounts there appears to be a nominal deficit of \$1,128,146.37; and against that there was absolutely paid on account of sinking fund \$182,400.

The ordinary or controllable expenditure amounted to only \$6,542,510, against \$7,062,095 in 1872-3, before the admission of Prince Edward Island into the Confederation, or \$1,800,000 per annum less than the expenditure relative to population in 1872-3.

Among the items of revenue we find Kingston to be an important contributor. The Customs Department collected during the fiscal year, and deposited to the credit of the Receiver-General, \$219,396.67, which sum was made up in this manner: Customs duties, \$218,448.07; coating licenses, entrance and clearance fees, \$708, and bonding warehouse fees, \$240.
