RAILWAY DEBENTURES.—It is proposed by the people of Renfrew to petition the Dominion Government to have that village relieved of the payment of the \$300,000 of debentures granted for the extension of the Canada Central R.R., on the ground that Government is now using the Canada Central, and subsidizing the same west of Pembroke, and starting point of the Canada Pacific. There is every probability that the Kingston and Pembroke Road will form a junction with the Canada Central at this place, and the Kingston & Pembroke will be extended before long.

PUBLIC WORKS.—RIDGEMAN HARBOUR IMPROVEMENT.—PUBLIC PROPERTY.—The annual report to Parliament of the Minister of Public Works is not so voluminous as the publications issued from some of the other Departments, but its contents embrace particulars of the important Public Works in which the country is interested. The Rideau Canal comes in for a considerable space, important repairs and changes having been reported last year. At Kingston it is noted that the Canal opened on the 1st of May, and during the season navigation was uninterrupted, and the water supply was good, owing to the precautions taken. The lock house at Kingston Mills was repaired, and the gates at Lower Brewer's, Davis, Old Sly's, Edwards', Barris', Hoghead, Hartwell, were overhauled. The lock-masters' houses and swing bridges were also repaired. The dams at Whitefish, Barris', Black Rapids, and Dow's swamps were maintained; new gates were added to the fourth lock at Jones' Falls, and generally the works were in good order. Vessels drawing 4 1/2 feet of water, and of 250 tonnage, are the largest which can pass through the locks. We also observe that a survey has been ordered to determine the amount of work required to obtain a navigable channel to Milford, about seven miles south of Pieton, in Prince Edward County. Instructions have been given for the entrance to Pieton harbour to be widened and deepened, and a turning basin formed. Additional dredging has been ordered to portions of Belleville harbour.

THE WAY THE MONEY GOES.—In Appendix No. 1 a statement is given, showing the amount expended by the Department of Public Works during the fiscal year. In this category we find the following items: Kingston Custom House..... \$ 256 44 " Immigration Shed..... 43 21 " Military School..... 64,286 22 " Penitentiary..... 4,778 89 " Post Office..... 89 24 All these sums were paid for repairs to the buildings, with the exception of the Military College, the figures opposite which are placed under the heading of "Construction." In the list of purchases and sales, mention is made of the transfer of the Rockwood Asylum to the Ontario Government at a valuation of \$60,000.

A Military Play.—On Saturday evening the McDowell Dramatic Company closed their season here, when to a good house (following a large audience at the matinee) they played "Ours," a military piece. It is a story of the present eastern excitement, and was produced with excellent effects.
