A POLITICAL SQUIB.

THE SCOTT FORGERY CASE REVIVED Mr. Grange, M.P.P. for Lennox, has been moving for the correspondence which passed tetween the Attorney-General and County Attorney Reeve. Napanee, respecting the Scott forgery case. He has scented a sensation, and for the first time in his political history appears to be extremely anxious to make a stir in the Legislature. He may succeed and he may not; the probability is he wil only raise a lively hornet's nest about his ears. It will be remembered that during the election between Mr. Hooper and Hon. Mr. Cartwright some humbrest wrote an address to the electors. which the name of the Conservative candidate was attached There may be differences as to the propriety of it, but at all events Mr. Scott. of the Express, had the 'address' printed, and as soon as this fact became known Mr. Hooper became fearfully incensed and set to work to have him punished. 
