DEAD BROUGHT TO LIFE.

A REMARKABLE MEDICAL EXPERIMENT.

The body of Merrick who was hanged for murder in Indianapolis last week, was taken from the gallows directly to the medical college there and temporarily restored to life by artificial means. The body was drawn upward at full length by the head, until the toes rested in the tub in which it had lain. Instantly the assistants rubbed the body briskly with coarse towels for two minutes, and then wrapped it, from the shoulders down, with a warm blauket. Than the head and neck were manipulated in every way to reset the dislocated joint. After this the hody was returned to the table, the windpipe opened and a tube inserted to which a bellows was attached. Some of the veins were opened to draw off the enagulated blood, and a jar of defibrinated sheep's blood was produced to be injected when all should be ready. And now came the trial, which al awaited in breathless anxiety. The professor of anatomy took charge of the jars of blood and milk, and was to turn the stopcocks to let it flow into the juglar vein, and thence into the heart, as the professor of physiology was to empty the blood from the heart with the aspirator (or air-pump) at the same time. Another student was to inflate the long with the bellows by a slow, easy motion, no m re rapidly than eighteen times a minute. Another assistant was to move a scapevalve on the bellows tube, so that when the lungs were filled it might empty itself of bad air, without blowing back into the bellows. Two other assistants stood by the batteries to make the connections at the word.

At the word 'Now!' every well-trained head and hand began to work -all in harmony - and quietly. No sound at first but the slow wheezing of the bellows, and the measured 'thub! thub!' of the piston of the air pump.

The clotted blood from the heart he poured into the receiver at first like a brown jelly, which, after a few moments, was thinner; at last a stream of thin warm blood. It was noticed that the blood mixture in the jar was perceptible lowering. The professor of physiology withdrew the aspirating needles, and stood with dilated pupils and flushed faces. The chest of the dead man was moving regularly. He grasped the pulse, and said in a whisper: 'A tremor! A tremor!' and then applying his ear to the chest for a moment, sprang up and cried out in an excited manner: 'By (1-d, it moves! I can feel its pulse.'
