The Run of 'Pinatore.'

Pinafore' is something unparallel-d in the history of the stage. There is scarcely a city on the continent that is not enjoying its preduction, and in many of them from two to four companies are presenting it nightly to crowded houses. The point of interest is its surprising popularity. No one seems to exactly understand the secret of its success. To be sure, it has 'taking' airs, but so have pleuty of other operas, and some of the French favorites so successfully produced by Aimee and others, are certainly as full of merit in this respect as 'Pinafore,' with perhaps this exception -- that the music of the latter is more simple. ludeed, there is nothing about Pinafore, that the most ordinary musician cannot master at once, and most of the airs are already familiar to the boys on the street. It is perhaps difficult to get at the exact cause of the marvelous success of the piece, and of course it is not dependent on any one virtue; but a little examination will show that no small part of its popularity is owing to the fact that it is not simply idiotic twaddle, like a large majority of the musical burlesques of the day, having no aim or object save musi a buff onery, but it is in reality one of the most effective satires on the modern style of conducting public affairs ever written. The audience laugh immoderately, but they think while they laugh, and they realize to the fullest extent, while with nessing the piece, the absurdity of placing men in high positions who are perfectly ignorant of the duties they are called upon to discharge. Beecher on Infanticide.

Mr. Beecher has been preaching against the great American crime of infanticide. He said that according to the Mosaic economy the life of the child was very precious; child murder was punished with death, whether ante-natal or after birth, by exposure or otherwise. By the Jews a mother was considered a murderer if she destroyed her child by anticipating its birth. The Greeks, Mr. Beecher said, were the most corrupt nation that ever ex ated: Solom and Gemorrah could have gone to school to them. The Hebrews were kept together by the family, out of which comes the sweetness of life. He declared that in Brooklyn and New York children by the hundreds and thousands, nor did mother blush at the thought of destroying their offspring before they came to life. There is doubtless a good deal of truth in Mr. Beecher's terrible charge. Only the other day New York was started by the death of a young lady by malpractice. Her death lead to the discovery of five other cases, happily not fatal, all testifying to the prevalence of the social plague.
