Biscuits have advanced twenty per cent, and canned goods, which only a week ago were a necessary of life, have been transformed into a luxury, with all that the term implies. Under the benehard ware and dry goods have gone with a bound, and consumers of these commodities rejoice in the opportunity afforded them to pay at last what articles are reasonably worth. The farmers are happy because the tariff increases their expenses without adding to their incomes, and they find themselves relieved from the necessity of hunting up places where-In to deposit their savings. Even the manufacturers are pleased.
