



Mr. Cartwright denied that Mr. Mackenzie had acted or spoken unpatriotically, or that he had destroyed the tirst Pacific Railway scheme. The truth was that the scheme was not destroyed until Senator Macpherson and Sir Hugh Allan squabbled over the spoils. The leader of the Opposition had not acted unpatriotically, whereas, on the other hand, the present Premier had been' expelled from office because, in his lust and greed for power, he had sold the charter of the great national highway for a paltry bribe, with which he could carry on the elections. The statement made by the Premier that five years of precious time had been lost was contradicted by his coldeague, who asserted that they had been well employed.

After recess, Mr. Cartwright referred at some length to the rapid increase of the annual expenditure, and he warned the Minister of Finance that if a check were not applied: lamentable consequences might ensure. The original estimates for 1880 were \$23,-437,000; the supplementary added made them \$23.923,000. The Riviere Du Loup purchase represented an annual charge of \$100,000, one hundred and twenty-five miles of railway ditto \$100. 000, and \$11,000,000 on public works, an annual charge of \$550,000, or a total and nual expenditure of \$24,500,000.

After remarks by Messra, Dawson and McLennan in favour of the road, Mr. Mills contended that the construction of the road was entirely beyond the resources of the country at the present time. No Asiatic trade of importance could ever pass over the read, and the argument built on such an hypothesis should avail little. He learned from the remarks of the Minister of Public Works that as yet no negotiations had been made with Great Britain regarding Imperial assistance, therefore he was surprised that the Government should have placed such a scheme before the House. It was a scheme, in his opinion, impracticable, and therefore he could not give it endors. ation. In conclusion, he argued that to push the road on to completion at the present time would cripple the resources of the country and retard its prosperity
