WEDNESDAY.

The economy of the present Ontario Government consisted in using nearly three million dollars of the handsome surplus left in the Treasury in 1871.

The only appreciable effect of the new tariff so far has been to give the price the poor man has to pay an upward tendency and to give an unprecedented impetus to smuggling.

Mr. McQuig, of Prince Edward, yesterday raised in the House of Commons the attack upon Vice-Chancellor Blake for using expressions at a church meeting which were never intended for publication, and which were not meant to be offensive to any class or creed differing from him in religion.
