As you know, a high protective tariff has been proposed in Canada. The existence of the Ministry which proposes it is now jeopardised. If they be thrown out it is probable that their successors will greatly modify the protective scheme. Many Canadians, even Protectionists, may remark, by no means approve of the scheme of Protection inaugurated by the present Ministry, considering it likely, on the one hand, to irritate the United States, and, on the other, to weaken the connection with Britain. overthrow would be viewed with pleasure by many here. Their position is this: Lord Lorne has transferred to England a request by his Ministers that Governor Letellier be dismissed for an action of last year-an action, nevertheless, constitutional, just,

and since endorsed by his province. Tte London Times, commenting on this, appears to consider that, spite of the apparent injustice, Lord Lorne must accept the advice of his Ministers, as they are supported by a majority of the pre-

sent Parliament. Let me point out that such is the extreme dissatisfaction now existing in Canada with the present Ministry, who have utterly failed in their promises that Lord Lorne has but to decline the advice and an election will follow, strongly supporting him and overturning the present

_____ Education of Women.

Queen's University, Kingston, has been thrown open to lady students on the same terms as male students. At last Canada has a University where the highest academical honors may be obtained by women who have the courage and ability to enter the contest. In England, Ireland, Scotland, Germany, France and the United States, provision is made for the admission of women to a University education, and now Canada can boast an equal advancement. A great deal of social backwardness is doubtless owing to the way in which our girls are educated. A few superficial accomplishments take the place of solid information, and many a home has been made wretched through the ignorance of common affairs, of an otherwise good and amiable young woman, when she has been brought to rule over a household. Of course we do not contend that it is necessary to give a girl a University education in order to make her fit to be a wife and mother, but we do hold that her education should be conducted with a view to this natural and almost inevitable destiny. But the opening of a University to those of the gentler sex who may desire to obtain a higher knowledge of art and science must lead to the adoption of a broader and truer system in the general training of girls, and to a higher development of the attributes of womanhood. In relation to this subject we are indebted to a correspondent of the Globe for reminding us of a classic passage of great truth and beauty: 'In reply to Arbaces, the beautiful Ione says 'Alas! is it only to be among men that freedom and virtue are to be deemed united? Why should the slavery that destroys you, be considered the only method to preserve us! Ah, believe me, it has been the great error of men, and one that has worked bitterly on their destinies, to imagine that the nature of women is (I will not say inferior, that may be so,) different from their own. In making laws unfavorable to the intellectual advancement of women, have they not in doing so made laws against their children, whom women are to rear;

against the husbands, of whom women are to be the friends, nay, sometimes, the advisers! And the young Greek lover, Glaucus, replies: 'Ever mayst thou think thus, Ione, ever be thy pure heart thy unerring guide! Happy had it been for Greece if she had given to the chatte the same intellectual charms that are so celebrated among the less worthy of her women.
