Yesterday was a most successful holiday, and the occasion is such as to leave pleasant and most delightful memories. The city was perhaps the liveliest it has ever been. In addition to its own population, there were as many as three thousand visitors, some of these coming from distant points, and taking an interest in passing proceedings which was not exceeded by those of local habitation. Handsome as they looked in their dress and decorations of Monday the effect seemed to be more satisfactory and appreciative yesterday. The general ap-

pearance of the streets was very attractive, and those who were instrumental in decking out the buildings in gayest colors, and those who witnessed the handiwork and artistic taste, also shared the gratification which the circumstance suggested. The great event of the day was the laying of the corner stone of Queen's College new building, which was arranged to take place at 11.30 o'clock, and for which the fullest preparations were made. In the whole lengthy and varied programme of Vice-regal festivities this was the leading feature, the one on which the great body of citizens had fixed the most attention. It was the chief characteristic of every public announcement, and properly so, since it was intended as a means of bringing the Princess into greater prominence, and having her set an important part in carrying out the details of a more than historic time in the records of Queen's University. There are some very well-remembered recollections in connection with this great institution of learning, but none can vie with the date of a great triumph.

Established thirty years ago on the model of the Scottish Universities by a Provincial Act, and incorporated immediately thereafter by a royal charter, Queen's College was one of the earliest and best of the works of higher education in Canada, and amid the many discouragements incident to a new country, it has prosecuted its work with a success, the extent of which will appear to your Excellency, and which we are proud to have here have gone forth seven hundred graduates in Divinity, Law, Arts, Science and Medicine. It will be gratifying to your Excellency to learn that the number of students now in attendance exceeds that of any former period in the history of the University, and also that its prospects are of the most cheering character, the more that the appeals, which have been lately made for its extension, have met with hearty support in all parts of the country, and from all classes of the people. We cordially welcome your Excellency and Her Royal Highness on this occasion, and we are most anxious to see the great interest in the foundation stone of the new College buildings, by His Excellency the Governor-General and Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise, on Friday, the 30th inst., at 11.30 A.M. These select seats were all occupied, scarcely an invitation card was issued that was not used. Every available seat was occupied, and so was the standing room. A great mass of people surrounded the new building, and a vast sea of upturned faces came in view from the scaffolded places which but a small quota of the applicants could secure.
