

Blan arose from his seat and looked around the cell, which was a high room, ten feet square, and suddenly struck the doctor on one shoulder with his fist, thus shoving him out of the way.

Then like a tiger, the prisoner bounded for the door of the cell, knocking the clergyman down as he rushed along, and running past the jailer, who clutched at Blan's coat. Blan rushed through the door, hitting his left side a heavy blow against the iron door frame which sent him spinning into the guard room, but he immediately recovered and ran to the door leading into the kitchen, and for the rear exit and stairway opening into the yard. The deputy sheriffs were in an adjoining room, and, though startled, they pursued at once, while Lieut. Martin gave orders to the military guard, consisting of sergeant Jas. R. He wept bitterly and exclaimed: 'It's not manly to seek my life so vengefully. I am a better man than any of you, but have to give up to the crowd and die like a dog.' On the scaffold Blan showed a terrible fear. but was finally emboldened a little with liquor. ---
