"So long as the Emperor can depend on his army he is master of the situation. I doubt it the Guards are in any way tainted with feelings of disloyalty: but the case may be different with the line regiments. Those which have been down in Turkey have had a certain amount of liberty, and they have come back with eelings of discontent." "Who are the Nibilists !"

"They are but an infinitesimal part of the population. The peasants are not among them. These latter are intensely loyal to the Emperor. The Nihilists are what you may call the literati. They are the writers, students and other classes possessed of a fair degree of education. These people are opposed to the present system of gevernment. There are also a reat many persons of all other classes who are dissatisfied with the present system of bribery and corruption which exists in the Government. While these persons are not Nihilists they would not be sorry if Nihilism would bring about a change of system. The importance attached to the Nihilists as a party is very terrorism; second, that of retribution. act and make a demonstration of strength. Not doing so, but exercising a system of

terrorism instead, is a palpable exhibition of weakness. Their purpose, on opportunity, is secret assassination. THE EMPEROR'S FEAR. "When I was at Odessa," interposed Lord Loftus' eldest son at this point, the troops were fairly compelled to barscade themselves to save the Emperor from the rage of the excited populace. was looking out of a window at the Emperor as he passed. The magistrate at the conclusion of the evidence said he could not see how, if the wife's story were true, the doctor should have been called in again. His province was to determine in the same manner as a grand juror, and as a juror would not convict on such evidence he would be obliged to dismiss the case, leaving the parties to carry it, if they chose, before the Grand Jury at the next Court.
