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PRINCE IMPERIAL. The Remains Lying in State at Petermaritzburg-Grand Requiem Mass. (Per Dominion Line.) London, June 28.—A notice from Cape Town to the 10th of June states—The body of the deceased Prince, after a funeral parade at which Lord Chelmsford was chief mourner, was removed to Petermaritzburg, where it lay in state in the Catholic Church. The body will arrive at Durban on the 11th inst. and be escorted by the garrison on board the man-of-war Boudicca for conveyance to Simon Bay, where it will be transferred to the troopship "Orontes" for transportation to England.
