



Do not misunderstand me. There are no better or finer meats in the world than ours, only we have not the weights or the bulk of the American cattle, which stand the rack of shipment better than our finer grades lo. Some of the finest cattle exhibited in the London market have been recently brought from the neighbourhood of Goelph and Fergus. Another grand lot came from the fine farms in Pickering, Bowmanville, and Oshawa. Another from Clinton and adjoining farms on the Buffalo & Lake Huron line, and another from Ailsa Craig and Forrest. The people here said that we must have splendid farms in our free and happy Canada. But your good sense will agree with me, that Canada is reaping a rich harvest by having free trade with Britain in this business, and by getting so many thousands of British gold in the Dominion. You will have heard, probably, that I showed some of our Canadian cattle in the beautiful city of Dublin. Their stallfed cattle are short this year, owing to
