# Advanced Thinkers.

THE MOST RESOLUTIONS OF A NOBLY BODY. (Discussions Independent.) A Congress of Advanced Thinkers, chiefly of visitors from a distance but with some residents of this district, was held in the village of the sitting of the Con-gress was continued through several days, the attendance being remarkably high.

It was decided that the Congress should promulgate a preliminary programme of its fundamental prin- ciples, and that such programme should be discussed generally by the Congress, and that such modification as might be suggested during the discussion should be entertained at the same hotel next year during the session. The following are the resolutions forming the preliminary programme.

1. That the time, liberty, and the pur- suit of happiness are the inalienable rights of man; that those rights are not secured by the existing political and social system; and that they can only be secured by the adoption and practice of the elementary principles of Christian- ity.

2. That as the State is the Father of the People, it is the duty of the State to provide for the education of its children, and that such education should include the teaching of a means of earning a livelihood.

3. That as the present system unjustly encourages the accumulation of great wealth among the few, instead of en- couraging the diffusion of moderate wealth among the many, it is therefore desirable that the existing taxation should be abolished, and the necessary means for maintaining law and order, and of educating and providing for the people should be obtained by means of a legacy duty on the transmission of all property from one generation to the next.

4. That every life should be secured by the State, that the payment of the premium should be compulsory, and should be obtained by a percentage on the value of the property of the insured.

5. That as the object of all Govern- ment is to secure protection to person and property, it is the duty of the Government to develop personal and pub- lic utility, and to correct the abuses of government, and of a correct public opinion, therefore a conviction for drunkenness should be punished by the loss of civic rights, and confinement in the reformatory asylum.

6. That as the land is the natural her- itage of the human family, land can only be held by individuals in trust for the benefit of the people; therefore the State should not dispose of itself in any lands to individuals, except by way of granting leases for a period not longer than one hundred years.

7. That as the object of this Congress is philanthropic, the Local Government of Ontario ought to defray its expenses, and that Mr. Goulais be authorized to send his bill to His Hon. Oliver Mowat for payment.
