Of course, the rash act of thus shooting down his ad versary was not justitiable, but the ex tenuating circumstances of the case should have been taken into account in rendering the verdict and pronouncing sentence. Many worse cases have resulted in complete acquittal or in trifling punishment, and although we do not believe in carrying leniency too far in such cases we do think that justice in this instages would be fully satisfied with less than the capital penalty.
